Application for rates and other charges to be effective January 1, 2025

1. OVERVIEW

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) is approving changes to the rates that Alectra Utilities Corporation (Alectra Utilities) charges to distribute electricity to its customers, effective January 1, 2025. This Decision and Rate Order impacts each of Alectra Utilities' five rate zones: the Enersource Rate Zone (covering the service area of the former Enersource Hydro Mississauga Inc.); the Brampton Rate Zone (covering the service area of the service area of the former Hydro One Brampton Networks Inc.); the PowerStream Rate Zone (covering the service area of the former PowerStream Inc.); the Horizon Rate Zone (covering the service area of the former Hydro Utilities area of the former PowerStream Inc.); the Horizon Rate Zone (covering the service area of the former Horizon Utilities Corporation); and the Guelph Rate Zone (covering the service area of the former Guelph Hydro Electricity System Inc.).

As a result of this Decision and Rate Order, there will be a monthly total bill impact for a residential customer consuming 750 kWh as follows:

- For the Enersource Rate Zone, a monthly total bill increase of \$0.10
- For the Brampton Rate Zone, a monthly total bill increase of \$0.07
- For the PowerStream Rate Zone, a monthly total bill decrease of \$1.10
- For the Horizon Rate Zone, a monthly total bill decrease of \$0.73
- For the Guelph Rate Zone, a monthly total bill decrease of \$0.96

The above changes do not factor in applicable taxes or the Ontario Electricity Rebate.

2. CONTEXT AND PROCESS

On December 8, 2016, the OEB granted Enersource Hydro Mississauga Inc., Horizon Utilities Corporation, and PowerStream Inc. approval to amalgamate, and approval to purchase and amalgamate with Hydro One Brampton Networks Inc. and continue as Alectra Utilities.¹ Alectra Utilities was granted a ten-year deferred rebasing period from 2017 to 2026 for the Horizon, Enersource, PowerStream, and Brampton Rate Zones. The Guelph Rate Zone was later acquired by Alectra Utilities² and was granted a ten-year deferred rebasing period from 2019 to 2028.

Alectra Utilities filed its application on August 15, 2024, under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* (OEB Act) and in accordance with <u>Chapter 3 (Incentive Rate-Setting Applications)</u> of the OEB's *Filing Requirements for Electricity Distribution Rate Applications* (Filing Requirements). The application was based on the Price Cap Incentive Rate-setting (Price Cap IR) option for each of Alectra Utilities' rate zones.

The Price Cap IR option is one of three incentive rate-setting mechanisms (IRM) used by the OEB.³ It involves setting rates through a cost of service application in the first year and mechanistic price cap adjustments which may be approved through IRM applications in the ensuing adjustment years.

The OEB follows a standardized and streamlined process for processing IRM applications filed under Price Cap IR. In each adjustment year of a Price Cap IR term, the OEB prepares a Rate Generator Model that includes, as a placeholder, information from the distributor's past proceedings and annual reporting requirements. A distributor will then review, complete, and include the model with its application, and may update the model during the proceeding to make any necessary corrections or to incorporate new rate-setting parameters as they become available.

Alectra Utilities serves approximately 1,083,000 mostly residential and commercial electricity customers in its five-rate zones. These five rate zones cover 17 communities that include: the cities of Hamilton and St. Catharines in the Horizon Rate Zone; the City of Brampton in the Brampton Rate Zone; the cities of Barrie, Markham, and Vaughan, and the towns of Aurora, Richmond Hill, Alliston, Beeton, Bradford West Gwillimbury, Penetanguishene, Thornton, and Tottenham in the PowerStream Rate Zone; the City of Mississauga in the Enersource Rate Zone; and the City of Guelph and the Village of Rockwood in the Guelph Rate Zone.

Notice of the application was issued on September 4, 2024. The School Energy Coalition (SEC) and Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition (VECC) requested intervenor status and cost eligibility. The OEB approved intervenor status and cost eligibility for SEC and VECC.

The application was supported by pre-filed written evidence and a completed set of Rate Generator Models and, as required during the proceeding, Alectra Utilities updated and clarified the evidence.

Alectra Utilities responded to interrogatories from OEB staff and VECC. Final submissions on the application were filed by OEB staff, SEC, VECC, and Alectra Utilities.

3. DECISION OUTLINE

Each of the following issues is addressed in this Decision and Rate Order, together with the OEB's findings.

- Annual Adjustment Mechanism
- Retail Transmission Service Rates
- Group 1 Deferral and Variance Accounts
- Lost Revenue Adjustment Mechanism Variance Account
- Renewable Generation Connection Rate Protection
- Capitalization Deferral Accounts
- Earnings Sharing Mechanism

Instructions for implementing Alectra Utilities' new rates and charges are set out in the final section of this Decision and Rate Order.

This Decision and Rate Order does not address rates and charges approved by the OEB in prior proceedings, such as specific service charges⁴ and loss factors, which are out of the scope of an IRM proceeding and for which no further approvals are required to continue to include them on the distributor's Tariff of Rates and Charges.

4. ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM

Alectra Utilities has applied to change its rates, effective January 1, 2025. The proposed rate change is based on a mechanistic rate adjustment using the OEB-approved **inflation minus X-factor** formula applicable to IRM applications. The adjustment applies to distribution rates (fixed and variable) uniformly across all customer classes and all rate zones.⁵

The components of the Price Cap IR adjustment formula applicable to Alectra Utilities are set out in the table below. Inserting these components into the formula results in a 3.30% increase to Alectra Utilities' rates: 3.30% = 3.60% - (0.00% + 0.30%).

An inflation factor of 3.60% applies to all IRM applications for the 2025 rate year. The Xfactor is the sum of the productivity factor and the stretch factor. It is a productivity offset that varies among different groupings of distributors. Subtracting the X-factor from inflation ensures that rates decline in real, constant-dollar terms, providing distributors with a tangible incentive to improve efficiency or else experience declining net income. The productivity component of the X-factor is based on industry conditions over a historical study period and applies to all IRM applications for the 2025 rate year. The stretch factor component of the X-factor is one of five stretch factor groupings established by the OEB, ranging from 0.00% to 0.60%. The stretch factor assigned to any distributor is based on the distributor's total cost performance as benchmarked

against other distributors in Ontario. The stretch factor assigned to Alectra Utilities is 0.30% for all rate zones, resulting in a rate adjustment of 3.30%.

OEB staff submitted that it has no concerns with Alectra Utilities' proposed Price Cap IR adjustment⁹, while SEC and VECC did not make any submissions on this issue. In its reply, Alectra Utilities noted that it included the inflation factor and stretch factor for a Price Cap IR adjustment of 3.30% for 2025 rates.¹⁰

Findings

Alectra Utilities' request for a 3.30% rate increase is in accordance with the annually updated parameters set by the OEB. The adjustment is approved, and Alectra Utilities' new rates shall be effective January 1, 2025.

5. RETAIL TRANSMISSION SERVICE RATES

In Ontario, some distributors are connected directly to a licensed transmitter, while others may be embedded, or partially-embedded, within the distribution system of another licensed distributor. Alectra Utilities' five rate zones are partially embedded within Hydro One Networks Inc.'s (Hydro One) distribution system. On November 1, 2024, the OEB announced preliminary Uniform Transmission Rates (UTRs) effective January 1, 2025.¹¹ The OEB also announced that an embedded distributor may update its Retail Transmission Service Rates (RTSRs) with Hydro One's proposed host-RTSRs.¹²

Alectra Utilities updated its RTSRs based on the preliminary UTRs and Hydro One's proposed host-RTSRs. The OEB sets the UTRs based on the approved revenue requirements for multiple transmitters. Preliminary UTRs are based on those revenue requirements that have already been approved for 2025. These preliminary UTRs are to be used for the setting of RTSRs to minimize the accumulation of variances in Retail Settlement Variance Accounts 1584 (Retail Transmission Network Charge) and 1586 (Retail Transmission Connection Charge). The cost consequences of any future adjustments to 2025 UTRs to reflect remaining approvals to a transmitter's revenue requirement will be tracked in these accounts and recovered over time.

To recover its cost of transmission services, Alectra Utilities requested approval to adjust the RTSRs that it charges its customers in accordance with the preliminary UTRs and proposed host-RTSRs for Hydro One.

OEB staff submitted that it has no concerns with Alectra Utilities' proposed adjustments to its 2025 RTSRs¹³ while SEC and VECC did not make any submissions.

Alectra Utilities submitted that the RTSRs should be approved, as updated in its reply submission, provided there are no changes in the final rate order.¹⁴

Findings

Alectra Utilities' proposed adjustment to its RTSRs is approved.

The RTSRs have been adjusted based on the preliminary UTRs and proposed host-RTSRs for Hydro One.¹⁵

If final UTRs and/or final host-RTSRs differ from the preliminary UTRs or proposed host-RTSRs, the resulting differences will be captured in Retail Settlement Variance Accounts 1584 (Retail Transmission Network Charge) and 1586 (Retail Transmission Connection Charge).

6. GROUP 1 DEFERRAL AND VARIANCE ACCOUNTS

In each year of an IRM term, the OEB will review a distributor's Group 1 deferral and variance accounts to determine whether those balances should be disposed of. OEB policy states that Group 1 account balances should be disposed of if they exceed, on a net basis (as a debit or credit), a pre-set disposition threshold of \$0.001 per kWh, unless a distributor can justify why balances should not be disposed of.¹⁶ If the net balance does not exceed the threshold, a distributor may still request disposition.¹⁷

Included in the Group 1 accounts are certain variances related to costs that are paid for by a distributor's customers on different bases, depending on their classification. "Class A" customers, who participate in the Industrial Conservation Initiative, pay for Global Adjustment (GA) charges based on their contribution to the five highest Ontario demand peaks over a 12-month period. "Class B" customers pay for GA charges based on their monthly consumption, either as a standalone charge or embedded in the Regulated Price Plan (RPP).¹⁸ A similar mechanism applies to Class A and Class B customers for Capacity Based Recovery (CBR) charges.¹⁹ The balance in the GA variance account is attributable to non-RPP Class B customers and is disposed of through a separate rate rider. The balance in the CBR Class B variance account is attributable to all Class B customers.

Horizon Rate Zone

The 2023 year-end net balance for the Horizon Rate Zone's Group 1 accounts eligible for disposition, including interest projected to December 31, 2024, is a debit of \$1,294,211 and pertains to variances accumulated during the 2023 calendar year. This amount represents a total claim of \$0.0003 per kWh, which does not exceed the disposition threshold. Alectra Utilities noted that the request for disposition is consistent with the OEB's letter regarding the Process for Incentive Regulation Mechanism Distribution Rate Applications, dated July 25, 2014 (the OEB's Letter), which stated that "distributors may elect to dispose of Group 1 balances below the threshold".²⁰ Alectra Utilities also explained that in its 2023 IRM application, although the balances were

below the threshold, Alectra Utilities elected to request disposition of the Group 1 balances, and the OEB, consistent with its letter,²¹ approved the disposition. As a result, Alectra Utilities requested the disposition of the Group 1 account balances for this rate zone over a one-year period.²²

Alectra Utilities had one or more Class A customers in the Horizon Rate Zone during the period in which variances accumulated so it has applied to have the balance of the CBR Class B variance account disposed of through a separate rate rider for Class B customers to ensure proper allocation between Class A and Class B customers.

During the period in which variances accumulated, Alectra Utilities had one or more customers in the Horizon Rate Zone transition between Class A and Class B. Under the general principle of cost causality, customer groups that cause variances that are recorded in Group 1 accounts should be responsible for paying the debits (or receiving credits) for their disposal. Alectra Utilities has proposed to allocate a portion of the Horizon Rate Zone GA and CBR Class B balances to its transition customers, based on their customer-specific consumption levels.²³ The amounts allocated to each transition customer are proposed to be recovered by way of 12 equal monthly installment payments.

Alectra Utilities submitted that its Group 1 account balances for the Horizon Rate Zone should be disposed of on a final basis.²⁴ No other party made a submission.

Findings

The balances proposed for disposition reconcile with the amounts reported as part of the OEB's *Electricity Reporting and Record-Keeping Requirements*.

Alectra Utilities requested disposition of \$1,294,211 over a one-year period. While the Group 1 balances are below the threshold, Alectra Utilities' request is consistent with the OEB's Letter.²⁵

The OEB approves the disposition of a debit balance of \$1,294,211 as of December 31, 2023, including interest projected to December 31, 2024, for the Horizon Rate Zone Group 1 accounts on a final basis.

The balance of each of the Group 1 accounts approved for disposition shall be transferred to the applicable principal and carrying charge sub-accounts of Account 1595. Such transfer shall be pursuant to the requirements specified in the *Accounting Procedures Handbook for Electricity Distributors*.²⁶ The date of the transfer must be the same as the effective date for the associated rates, which is generally the start of the rate year.

The OEB approves these balances to be disposed of through final rate riders, charges, or payments, as calculated in the Rate Generator Model. The final rate riders, charges, and payments, as applicable, will be in effect over a one-year period from January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.²⁷

Brampton Rate Zone

The 2023 year-end net balance for the Brampton Rate Zone's Group 1 accounts eligible for disposition, including interest projected to December 31, 2024, is a debit of \$4,761,388 and pertains to variances accumulated during the 2023 calendar year. This amount represents a total claim of \$0.0011 per kWh, which exceeds the disposition threshold.

Alectra Utilities has requested the disposition of this amount over a one-year period.

Alectra Utilities had one or more Class A customers in the Brampton Rate Zone during the period in which variances accumulated so it has applied to have the balance of the CBR Class B variance account disposed of through a separate rate rider for Class B customers to ensure proper allocation between Class A and Class B customers.

During the period in which variances accumulated, Alectra Utilities had one or more customers in the Brampton Rate Zone transition between Class A and Class B. Under the general principle of cost causality, customer groups that cause variances that are recorded in Group 1 accounts should be responsible for paying the debits (or receiving credits) for their disposal. Alectra Utilities has proposed to allocate a portion of the Brampton Rate Zone GA and CBR Class B balances to its transition customers, based on their customer-specific consumption levels.²⁸ The amounts allocated to each transition customer are proposed to be recovered by way of 12 equal monthly installment payments.

Alectra Utilities submitted that its Group 1 account balances for the Brampton Rate Zone should be disposed of on a final basis.²⁹ No other party made a submission.

Findings

The balances proposed for disposition reconcile with the amounts reported as part of the OEB's *Electricity Reporting and Record-Keeping Requirements.*

The OEB approves the disposition of a debit balance of \$4,761,388 as of December 31, 2023, including interest projected to December 31, 2024, for the Brampton Rate Zone Group 1 accounts on a final basis.

Table 6.2 identifies the principal and interest amounts, which the OEB approves for disposition.

The balance of each of the Group 1 accounts approved for disposition shall be transferred to the applicable principal and carrying charge sub-accounts of Account 1595. Such transfer shall be pursuant to the requirements specified in the *Accounting Procedures Handbook for Electricity Distributors.*³⁰ The date of the transfer must be the

same as the effective date for the associated rates, which is generally the start of the rate year.

The OEB approves these balances to be disposed of through final rate riders, charges, or payments, as calculated in the Rate Generator Model. The final rate riders, charges, and payments, as applicable, will be in effect over a one-year period from January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.³¹

PowerStream Rate Zone

The 2023 year-end net balance for the PowerStream Rate Zone's Group 1 accounts eligible for disposition, including interest projected to December 31, 2024, is a debit of \$5,168,590 and pertains to variances accumulated during the 2023 calendar year. This amount represents a total claim of \$0.0006 per kWh, which does not exceed the disposition threshold. Alectra Utilities noted that the request for disposition is consistent with the OEB's Letter which stated that "distributors may elect to dispose of Group 1 balances below the threshold".³² Alectra Utilities explained that in its 2023 IRM application, although the balances were below the threshold, Alectra Utilities elected to request the disposition of the Group 1 balances, and the OEB, consistent with its letter,³³ approved the disposition. As a result, Alectra Utilities requested the disposition of the Group 1 account balances for this rate zone over a one-year period.³⁴

Alectra Utilities had one or more Class A customers in the PowerStream Rate Zone during the period in which variances accumulated so it has applied to have the balance of the CBR Class B variance account disposed of through a separate rate rider for Class B customers to ensure proper allocation between Class A and Class B customers.

During the period in which variances accumulated, Alectra Utilities had one or more customers in the PowerStream Rate Zone transition between Class A and Class B. Under the general principle of cost causality, customer groups that cause variances that are recorded in Group 1 accounts should be responsible for paying the debits (or receiving credits) for their disposal. Alectra Utilities has proposed to allocate a portion of the PowerStream Rate Zone GA and CBR Class B balances to its transition customers, based on their customer-specific consumption levels.³⁵ The amounts allocated to each

transition customer are proposed to be recovered by way of 12 equal monthly installment payments.

Alectra Utilities submitted that its Group 1 account balances for the PowerStream Rate Zone should be disposed of on a final basis.³⁶ No other party made a submission.

Findings

The balances proposed for disposition reconcile with the amounts reported as part of the OEB's *Electricity Reporting and Record-Keeping Requirements.*

Alectra Utilities requested disposition of \$5,168,590 over a one-year period. While the Group 1 balances are below the threshold, Alectra Utilities' request is consistent with the OEB's Letter.³⁷

The OEB approves the disposition of a debit balance of \$5,168,590 as of December 31, 2023, including interest projected to December 31, 2024, for the PowerStream Rate Zone Group 1 accounts on a final basis.

Table 6.3 identifies the principal and interest amounts, which the OEB approves for disposition.

The balance of each of the Group 1 accounts approved for disposition shall be transferred to the applicable principal and carrying charge sub-accounts of Account 1595. Such transfer shall be pursuant to the requirements specified in the *Accounting Procedures Handbook for Electricity Distributors*.³⁸ The date of the transfer must be the same as the effective date for the associated rates, which is generally the start of the rate year.

The OEB approves these balances to be disposed of through final rate riders, charges, or payments, as calculated in the Rate Generator Model. The final rate riders, charges, and payments, as applicable, will be in effect over a one-year period from January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.³⁹

Enersource Rate Zone

The 2023 year-end net balance for the Enersource Rate Zone's Group 1 accounts eligible for disposition, including interest projected to December 31, 2024, is a debit of \$14,999,118 and pertains to variances accumulated during the 2023 calendar year. This amount represents a total claim of \$0.0022 per kWh, which exceeds the disposition threshold.

Alectra Utilities has requested the disposition of this amount over a one-year period.

Alectra Utilities had one or more Class A customers in the Enersource Rate Zone during the period in which variances accumulated so it has applied to have the balance of the

CBR Class B variance account disposed of through a separate rate rider for Class B customers to ensure proper allocation between Class A and Class B customers.

During the period in which variances accumulated, Alectra Utilities had one or more customers in the Enersource Rate Zone transition between Class A and Class B. Under the general principle of cost causality, customer groups that cause variances that are recorded in Group 1 accounts should be responsible for paying the debits (or receiving credits) for their disposal. Alectra Utilities has proposed to allocate a portion of the Enersource Rate Zone GA and CBR Class B balances to its transition customers, based on their customer-specific consumption levels.⁴⁰ The amounts allocated to each transition customer are proposed to be recovered by way of 12 equal monthly installment payments.

Alectra Utilities submitted that its Group 1 account balances for the Enersource Rate Zone should be disposed of on a final basis.⁴¹ No other party made a submission.

Findings

The balances proposed for disposition reconcile with the amounts reported as part of the OEB's *Electricity Reporting and Record-Keeping Requirements.*

The OEB approves the disposition of a debit balance of \$14,999,118 as of December 31, 2023, including interest projected to December 31, 2024, for the Enersource Rate Zone Group 1 accounts on a final basis.

The balance of each of the Group 1 accounts approved for disposition shall be transferred to the applicable principal and carrying charge sub-accounts of Account 1595. Such transfer shall be pursuant to the requirements specified in the *Accounting Procedures Handbook for Electricity Distributors*.⁴² The date of the transfer must be the same as the effective date for the associated rates, which is generally the start of the rate year.

The OEB approves these balances to be disposed of through final rate riders, charges, or payments, as calculated in the Rate Generator Model. The final rate riders, charges, and payments, as applicable, will be in effect over a one-year period from January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.⁴³

Guelph Rate Zone

The 2023 year-end net balance for the Guelph Rate Zone's Group 1 accounts eligible for disposition, including interest projected to December 31, 2024, is a debit of \$1,339,953 and pertains to variances accumulated during the 2023 calendar year. This amount represents a total claim of \$0.0008 per kWh, which does not exceed the disposition threshold. Alectra Utilities noted that although the balances are below the threshold, the request for disposition is consistent with the OEB's Letter which stated

that "distributors may elect to dispose of Group 1 balances below the threshold".⁴⁴ Alectra Utilities explained that in its 2023 IRM application, although the balances were below the threshold, Alectra Utilities elected to request disposition of the Group 1 balances, and the OEB, consistent with its letter,⁴⁵ approved the disposition. As a result, Alectra Utilities requested the disposition of the Group 1 account balances for this rate zone over a one-year period.⁴⁶

Alectra Utilities had one or more Class A customers in the Guelph Rate Zone during the period in which variances accumulated so it has applied to have the balance of the CBR Class B variance account disposed of through a separate rate rider for Class B customers to ensure proper allocation between Class A and Class B customers.

During the period in which variances accumulated, Alectra Utilities had one or more customers in the Guelph Rate Zone transition between Class A and Class B. Under the general principle of cost causality, customer groups that cause variances that are recorded in Group 1 accounts should be responsible for paying the debits (or receiving credits) for their disposal. Alectra Utilities has proposed to allocate a portion of the Guelph Rate Zone GA and CBR Class B balances to its transition customers, based on their customer-specific consumption levels.⁴⁷ The amounts allocated to each transition customer are proposed to be recovered by way of 12 equal monthly installment payments.

Alectra Utilities submitted that its Group 1 account balances for the Guelph Rate Zone should be disposed of on a final basis. No other party made a submission.

Findings

The balances proposed for disposition reconcile with the amounts reported as part of the OEB's *Electricity Reporting and Record-Keeping Requirements*.

Alectra Utilities requested disposition of \$1,339,953 over a one-year period. While the Group 1 balances are below the threshold, Alectra Utilities' request is consistent with the OEB's Letter.⁴⁸

The OEB approves these balances to be disposed of through final rate riders, charges, or payments, as calculated in the Rate Generator Model. The final rate riders, charges, and payments, as applicable, will be in effect over a one-year period from January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.⁵⁰

7. LOST REVENUE ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM VARIANCE ACCOUNT

The OEB has historically used a Lost Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (LRAM) Variance Account (LRAMVA) to capture implications for a distributor's revenues which arise from differences between actual and forecast Conservation and Demand Management (CDM) savings included in its last OEB-approved load forecast. The use of the LRAMVA is no longer the default approach for CDM activities.

The OEB has recently issued guidelines to electricity distributors related to non-wires solutions.⁵¹ In accordance with these guidelines, a distributor may request the use of an LRAMVA for distribution-rate funded non-wires solutions, and this may include traditional CDM activities or Local Initiatives Program activities, with need to be determined on a case-by-case basis.

Distributors delivered CDM programs to their customers through the Conservation First Framework (CFF) that began on January 1, 2015, until March 20, 2019, when the CFF was revoked.⁵²

Distributors that do not have a confirmed zero balance in the LRAMVA are required to seek disposition as part of their IRM application, with supporting information, or provide a rationale for not doing so.⁵³

Distributors are also eligible to make an LRAMVA request relating to persisting impacts of conservation programs until their next rebasing. The OEB previously provided direction for distributors to seek approval of LRAM-eligible amounts for 2023 onwards on a prospective basis, and a rate rider in the corresponding rate year, to address amounts that would otherwise be recorded in the LRAMVA for all years until their next rebasing application.

Alectra Utilities stated it had a zero balance in the LRAMVA. In this proceeding, Alectra Utilities is seeking rate riders for 2025 rates to recover the base LRAMVA eligible amount for 2025, which was approved in Alectra Utilities in 2024.⁵⁴

Alectra Utilities had LRAM-eligible amounts for future years approved on a prospective basis in a previous year. For the 2025 rate year, Alectra Utilities was approved for a prospective LRAM-eligible amount of \$8,309,184 in 2024 dollars.⁵⁵

Prospective LRAM amounts are to be adjusted mechanistically by the approved inflation minus X-factor applicable to IRM applications in effect for a given year and recovered through a rate rider in the corresponding rate year.⁵⁶ Applying Alectra Utilities' approved 2025 inflation minus X-factor adjustments to the previously approved prospective balance for the 2025 rate year, results in an amount of \$8,583,389.⁵⁷

Alectra Utilities' previously approved prospective LRAM-eligible amounts for clearance in the 2026 rate year have also been updated to 2025 dollars, in accordance with the OEB's guidance on prospective LRAM amounts.⁵⁸ Applying Alectra Utilities' approved 2025 inflation minus X-factor adjustment to the previously approved prospective balance for the 2026 rate year, results in an amount of \$8,054,213 in 2025 dollars.⁵⁹

Alectra Utilities submitted that the LRAMVA balances for all rate zones should be approved as filed. No other party made a submission.

Findings

The OEB approves the disposition of the mechanistically adjusted LRAM-eligible amount for the 2025 rate year of \$8,583,389, as set out in Table 7.1. The OEB also confirms the previously approved LRAM-eligible amounts, which have been mechanistically adjusted to 2025 dollars by applying the approved inflation minus X-factor, as set out in Table 7.2 below.⁶⁰

8. RENEWABLE GENERATION CONNECTION RATE PROTECTION

Subsection 79.1(1) of the OEB Act states that the OEB may provide Renewable Generation Connection Rate Protection (RGCRP) compensation amounts to eligible distributors. Ontario Regulation 330/09 prescribes the methodology that the OEB uses to determine the amounts for any given year.

Ontario distributors are required to plan their systems based on their expectations of new electricity generation projects connecting to their systems. Based on their plans, distributors can apply to the OEB for funding to recover the cost of assets to enable and connect generators to their distribution systems, including generators using renewable sources of energy such as wind or solar. The OEB then takes steps to ensure that all Ontario customers, not just the ratepayers of the individual distributor, contribute to the costs of investments to connect renewable generators in accordance with the applicable legislation.

The OEB approved 2021 RGCRP funding for the Brampton, PowerStream, and Enersource Rate Zones in its decision on Alectra Utilities' 2021 IRM application.⁶³ The OEB also approved an update to the RGCRP models for these three rate zones by extending the calculations for the RGCRP funding amounts for each year between 2022 and 2026. The OEB's subsequent RGCRP funding approval in Alectra Utilities' 2024 IRM application, and the 2025 RGCRP funding request in this proceeding, are based on the amount that was approved by the OEB in Alectra Utilities' 2021 IRM application.

Brampton Rate Zone

Alectra Utilities has requested to collect RGCRP funding of \$125,149 (or \$10,429 per month) in 2025 for the Brampton Rate Zone. In response to an OEB staff interrogatory,⁶⁴ Alectra Utilities confirmed that the schedule provided in the current proceeding is consistent with RGCRP amounts previously approved by the OEB. Specifically, the amounts are related to renewable enabling improvement investments and renewable expansion investments funding between 2022 and 2026 for the Brampton Rate Zone, as approved in Alectra Utilities' 2021 IRM application proceeding.⁶⁵

OEB staff did not take issue with Alectra Utilities' 2025 RGCRP funding request for its Brampton Rate Zone and submitted that the payment amount of \$125,149 is appropriate. VECC and SEC did not make any submissions on this request.

In its reply, Alectra Utilities submitted that the 2025 RGCRP funding amounts for the Brampton Rate Zone should be approved as filed.

PowerStream Rate Zone

Alectra Utilities has requested to collect RGCRP funding of \$234,307 (or \$19,526 per month) in 2025 for the PowerStream Rate Zone. In response to an OEB staff interrogatory,⁶⁶ Alectra Utilities confirmed that the schedule provided in the current proceeding is consistent with RGCRP amounts previously approved by the OEB. The schedule is related to the associated RGCRP funding between 2022 and 2026 for PowerStream Rate Zone, as approved in Alectra Utilities' 2021 IRM application.⁶⁷

OEB staff did not take issue with Alectra Utilities' 2025 RGCRP funding request for its PowerStream Rate Zone and submitted that the payment amount of \$234,307 is appropriate. VECC and SEC did not make any submissions on this request.

Alectra Utilities submitted that the 2025 RGCRP funding amounts for the PowerStream Rate Zone should be approved as filed.

Enersource Rate Zone

Alectra Utilities has requested to collect RGCRP funding of \$130,810 (or \$10,901 per month) in 2025 for the Enersource Rate Zone. In response to an OEB staff interrogatory,⁶⁸ Alectra Utilities confirmed that the schedule provided in the current proceeding is consistent with RGCRP amounts previously approved by the OEB. The schedule is related to the associated RGCRP funding between 2022 and 2026 for the Enersource Rate Zone, as approved in Alectra Utilities' 2021 IRM proceeding.⁶⁹

OEB staff did not take issue with Alectra Utilities' request for 2025 RGCRP funding for its Enersource Rate Zone and submitted that the payment of \$130,810 is appropriate. VECC and SEC did not make any submissions on this request.

Alectra Utilities submitted, through its reply argument, that the 2025 RGCRP funding amounts for the Enersource Rate Zone should be approved as filed.

Findings

The OEB approves 2025 RGCRP funding of \$125,149 for the Brampton Rate Zone, \$234,307 for the PowerStream Rate Zone, and \$130,810 for the Enersource Rate Zone. The OEB finds no material changes from the 2024 approved funding (Brampton Rate Zone \$129,051, PowerStream Rate Zone \$239,343, and Enersource Rate Zone \$135,973). The OEB agrees with OEB staff that the funding requests are appropriate.

9. CAPITALIZATION DEFERRAL ACCOUNTS

International Financial Reporting Standard 3 (IFRS 3)⁷⁰ is an accounting standard issued by the International Accounting Standards Board that guides accounting for business combinations. A business combination is a transaction in which an acquirer obtains control over one or more businesses. International Financial Reporting Standard 10 (IFRS 10)⁷¹ is an accounting standard that outlines the requirements for an entity that controls another (a parent) to present consolidated financial statements.

In accordance with IFRS 3 and IFRS 10, the capitalization policies of the former Enersource Hydro Mississauga Inc., Horizon Utilities Corporation, and Hydro One Brampton Networks Inc. were changed in 2017 to conform to the capitalization policy of the acquirer, the former PowerStream Inc. The OEB's Partial Decision and Order⁷² in Alectra Utilities' 2020 IRM application adopted the Account 1576 approach for the Horizon, Brampton, and Enersource Rate Zones to calculate the amounts to be recorded in the deferral accounts established to capture the impacts of changes in capitalization policy following the formation of Alectra Utilities.⁷³ The OEB also approved a deferral account for the Guelph Rate Zone on the same basis as the deferral accounts for the other three rate zones effective January 1, 2020.⁷⁴ Disposition of the accounts was determined to take place during Alectra Utilities' next rebasing application.

In its 2020 IRM application, Alectra Utilities noted challenges it faced in tracking the actual impacts of the change in the accounting policy for each rate zone, starting in 2019, due to its newly implemented Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system. Alectra Utilities proposed an allocation methodology to determine the capitalization policy impacts for each rate zone starting with the 2019 fiscal year. In its Partial Decision and Order on Alectra Utilities' 2020 IRM application, the OEB accepted Alectra Utilities' approach, but determined it would be appropriate for Alectra Utilities "...to continue to monitor the results of the allocation methodology for unexpected results that might lead to the conclusion that an amendment is required to the allocation approach on a prospective basis."⁷⁵

In the OEB's Decision and Order for Alectra Utilities' 2022 IRM application, Alectra Utilities was directed to continue to file evidence justifying why the allocation

methodology remains appropriate, quantifying the differences between actual and forecast allocations, and explaining the key drivers, particularly if the differences are material.⁷⁶

In this proceeding, Alectra Utilities provided balances as of December 31, 2023, in the capitalization deferral accounts for the Horizon Rate Zone, Enersource Rate Zone, Brampton Rate Zone, and Guelph Rate Zone. For the 2023 balances, Alectra Utilities used the same allocation methodology that was used, and accepted by the OEB, to determine 2019 balances. Alectra Utilities applied the allocation percentages to the 2023 actual distribution plant capital to determine the capitalization policy change impacts on the Horizon Rate Zone, Enersource Rate Zone, Brampton Rate Zone, and Guelph Rate Zone. Alectra Utilities explained that it determined the allocation percentages by rate zone based on a ratio of the actual impact of the capitalization policy change, before the ERP system convergence, to the actual distribution plant capital for the capitalization policy impacts included in the 2020 IRM application were driven by the actual distribution plant capital expenditures in any given year.

Alectra Utilities provided the net capitalization policy impacts for each of its rate zones from 2017 to 2023, as set out in Table 9.1 below.

Alectra Utilities explained that changes to the capitalization policy impact for 2023 are the result of increased System Access and System Renewal capital for the Enersource Rate Zone and Guelph Rate Zone, and increased System Access capital for the Brampton Rate Zone.

Alectra Utilities noted that it would continue to report on the actual balance in the capitalization deferral accounts for the Horizon, Enersource, Brampton and Guelph Rate Zones, using the allocation methodology approved by the OEB in its 2020 IRM application.⁷⁷ No parties made a submission on the capitalization policy.

Findings

No approvals were sought in this application related to the capitalization deferral accounts. The OEB agrees with Alectra Utilities that it is appropriate to use the allocation methodology previously approved by the OEB in the Partial Decision and Order in the 2020 IRM application. In that Partial Decision and Order, the OEB also found that the disposition of the capitalization deferral accounts at the next rebasing is appropriate.⁷⁸

10. EARNINGS SHARING MECHANISM

On March 26, 2015, the OEB issued its *Report of the Board: Rate-making Associated with Distributor Consolidation* (MAADs Policy).⁷⁹ The MAADs Policy introduced an extended deferred rebasing period for consolidating entities and included a requirement for an earnings sharing mechanism (ESM).

The MAADs Policy states:

The consolidating entities requesting a deferred re-basing period of greater than five years will be required to present the OEB with an ESM plan that would be implemented if the consolidated entity's [Return on Equity] was greater than 300 basis points above the allowed [Return on Equity] as set out under the incentive regulation policy. The ESM will be based on a 50:50 sharing of excess earnings with consumers.⁸⁰

The OEB's Handbook to Electricity Distributor and Transmitter Consolidations states that "no evidence is required in support of an ESM that follows the form set out in the [MAADs Policy]."⁸¹

Alectra Utilities does not have an "approved" Return on Equity (ROE) against which the earnings sharing could be determined since it has not rebased its rates. Alectra Utilities filed a proposal in its 2020 IRM application⁸² that, for the purpose of the ESM calculation, the representative OEB-approved ROE for Alectra Utilities would be calculated as the weighted average of the OEB-approved rate base amounts for each rate zone from the most recent OEB-approved rebasing application for each predecessor company. The proposal further stated that the regulatory net income for the purpose of earnings sharing would be calculated in the same manner as net income for regulatory purposes under the Reporting and Record keeping Requirements (RRR) filings, in accordance with the *RRR 2.1.5.6 ROE Complete Filing Guide,* issued March 2016.⁸³

In Alectra Utilities' 2020 IRM application, the OEB approved Alectra Utilities' ESM proposal as filed and stated that the proposal was consistent with the MAADs Policy. The OEB further noted that the ESM shall consider the earnings of Alectra Utilities in

years six to ten of the deferred rebasing period as a consolidated entity.⁸⁴ The proposal utilizes a weighted average ROE for all applicable rate zones in determining the approved ROE for Alectra Utilities.

In this proceeding, Alectra Utilities stated that its deemed ROE is 8.95%, which is calculated using the weighted average of the OEB-approved deemed equity portion of the rate base for all five rate zones. Alectra Utilities' actual 2023 ROE for all five rate zones was 7.55%, which is 140 basis points below the calculated deemed ROE of 8.95%.

To determine if the ESM is triggered in this proceeding, Alectra Utilities calculated a deemed ROE for Alectra Utilities' four rate zones (excluding the Guelph Rate Zone) of 8.94%.⁸⁵ The weighting factors were derived using 2017 and 2018 ROE data from the respective annual RRR filings for Alectra Utilities and the former Guelph Hydro Electricity System Inc. Since the Alectra Utilities and Guelph Hydro Electricity System Inc. merger was effective January 1, 2019, Alectra Utilities' four rate zones and the former Guelph Hydro Electricity System Inc. filed separate RRR 2.1.5.6 ROE calculations for 2017 and 2018. Alectra Utilities applied both 2017 and 2018 weighting factors to the 2023 Consolidated Adjusted Regulated Net Income, Rate Base and Regulated Deemed Equity amounts to derive the 2023 ROE for Alectra Utilities' four rate zones. This results in an ROE that is either 145 basis points (using 2017 weighting factors) or 141 basis points (using 2018 weighting factors) below a deemed ROE of 8.94%.

In response to interrogatories⁸⁶, Alectra Utilities explained that the 2017 and 2018 Achieved ROE data used to derive weighting factors corresponds to the RRR 2.1.5.6 ROE submissions filed separately by Alectra Utilities four rate zones and the former Guelph Hydro Electricity System Inc. in the respective years. The 2023 Achieved ROE percentage (excluding the Guelph Rate Zone) was calculated by applying the 2017 and 2018 weighting factors for the four rate zones to the 2023 consolidated financial results. The Guelph Rate Zone ROE was calculated based on the difference between Alectra Consolidated ROE and Alectra Utilities' four rate zones.

OEB staff submitted that the methodology used above is consistent with the OEBapproved Alectra Utilities' ESM proposal filed in the 2020 IRM application.

In response to interrogatories⁸⁷, Alectra Utilities also confirmed that the calculation of the deemed equity portion of the rate base was the same as what was approved as part of each legacy utility's last rebasing application.

OEB staff reviewed the evidence and noted no issue with the calculation of the deemed equity portion of the rate base (\$) for each rate zone provided by Alectra Utilities.

In response to an interrogatory⁸⁸, Alectra Utilities explained that the reason for excluding the adjustment for net operating maintenance and administrative expenses (OM&A) merger savings in its calculation of achieved ROE in 2023 is to ensure that the calculated ROE includes the savings Alectra Utilities achieved as a result of the consolidation, which is consistent with ESM requirements in the MAADs Policy. OEB staff noted that Alectra Utilities, as a whole, for 2023 did not over-earn based on its reported ROE. OEB staff submitted that Alectra Utilities' proposed disposition of nil is reasonable and should be accepted for the purpose of calculating all rate zones' 2023 achieved ROE.

Both VECC and SEC submitted that net OM&A merger savings adjustments should be included in the calculation of ROE in years one to five of the rebasing deferral period. The intervenors requested clarification in Alectra Utilities' reply submission that the savings were included.

In its reply submission, Alectra Utilities confirmed that the final ROE calculations included merger savings and were consistent with the MAADs Policy ESM requirements. Alectra Utilities noted that the merger savings adjustments incorporated into the ROE calculation in years one to five were not applied to the ROE calculation in years six to ten, which ensured that ROE reflected the savings achieved from consolidation. Alectra Utilities compared the ROE with and without merger savings adjustment and noted that its higher ROE for 2023 of 7.55% was used to evaluate whether the ESM was triggered.⁸⁹

Alectra Utilities submitted that its calculation of 2023 ROE is accurate for the purpose of earnings sharing and submitted that the ESM is not triggered.⁹¹

Findings

The OEB concludes that the ESM has not been triggered because Alectra Utilities did not exceed the OEB-approved ROE. There was confusion as to whether Alectra Utilities had included merger savings in the earnings used to calculate the ROE. In its reply submission, Alectra Utilities confirmed that merger savings were included and provided the ROE calculations both with and without the merger savings to support its position. The OEB agrees that including the merger savings is the appropriate approach for determining whether the ESM was triggered for 2023 earnings and is consistent with the policy's intent.

11. IMPLEMENTATION

This Decision and Rate Order is accompanied by the Rate Generator Models, applicable supporting models, and a Tariff of Rates and Charges (Schedule A). The Rate Generator Models also incorporate the following regulatory rates and charges set out in Table Table 11.1.

Each of the rates is a component of the "Regulatory Charge" on a customer's bill, established annually by the OEB through a separate, generic order. The RRRP and WMS rates were set by the OEB on December 10, 2024.⁹²

The Smart Metering Entity Charge is a component of the "Distribution Charge" on a customer's bill, established by the OEB through a separate order. The Smart Metering Entity Charge was set by the OEB on September 8, 2022.⁹³

In the Report of the Board: Review of Electricity Distribution Cost Allocation Policy, the OEB indicated that it will review the default province-wide microFIT charge annually to ensure it continues to reflect actual costs in accordance with the established methodology. On November 19, 2024, the OEB issued a letter advising electricity

12. ORDER

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Alectra Utilities Corporation's new final distribution rates shall be effective January 1, 2025, in accordance with this Decision and Rate Order.
- 2. The Tariff of Rates and Charges set out in Schedule A of this Decision and Rate Order is deemed draft until the following procedural steps have been complied with:
 - i. Alectra Utilities Corporation shall review the Tariff of Rates and Charges and shall file with the OEB a written confirmation of its completeness and accuracy, or provide a detailed explanation of any inaccuracies or missing information, by December 19, 2024.
 - ii. The Tariff of Rates and Charges will be considered final if Alectra Utilities Corporation does not provide a submission to the OEB that inaccuracies were found or information was missing pursuant to item 2.i
 - iii. If the OEB receives a submission from Alectra Utilities Corporation to the effect that inaccuracies were found or information was missing pursuant to item 2.i, the OEB will consider the submission and issue a final Rate Order.
- 3. Alectra Utilities Corporation shall notify its customers of the rate changes no later than the delivery of the first bill reflecting the new rates.

COST AWARDS

The OEB will issue a separate decision on cost awards once the following steps are completed:

- 1. VECC and SEC shall file with the OEB and copy Alectra Utilities Corporation its cost claims no later than December 19, 2024.
- 2. Alectra Utilities Corporation shall file with the OEB and forward to VECC and SEC any objections to the claimed costs by January 15, 2025.
- 3. VECC and SEC shall file with the OEB and forward to Alectra Utilities Corporation any responses to any objections for cost claims by January 22, 2025.
- 4. Alectra Utilities Corporation shall pay the OEB's costs incidental to this proceeding upon receipt of the OEB's invoice.
